Drexel Autism Institute, Drexel University, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, is author of "Implementing the Group-Based Early Start Denver Model for Preschoolers with Autism." His career has been driven by a key commitment, namely understanding the nature of learning difficulties in autism and developing effective programs to address such difficulties within community-based settings. This commitment reflects his life experience of growing up with two brothers with autism, as well as his diverse clinical and research background, which include postdoctoral experiences at the University of California Davis MIND Institute and the Olga Tennison Autism Research Centre, Australia.
